SEISA Africa Asia Bridge 2022 Event report

Under the theme of Chikei ("To know and to connect"), the SEISA Group's largest event "SEISA Africa Asia Bridge 2022 (commonly known as SAAB)" was held on Saturday, November 12, 2022 for the purpose of international exchange in Africa and Asia. This time, we welcomed guests to the venue for the first time in three years and continued to implement a hybrid format that connects all programs online. We were able to expand our circle of learning and relationships with about 40,000 people from more than 31 countries, mainly in Africa and Asia.

SAAB, which has continued to evolve every year and celebrated its 8th event, this year, seven channels were distributed simultaneously. In the Chikei Project Ch. (4ch) "Bhutan, Eritrea, Myanmar Cultural Exchange", we connected with a Japanese language school in Myanmar and deepened exchanges with local students. In addition to students from Eritrea and Bhutan studying at SEISA, Su Myat Myat Naing and Kaung Khant Oo, who came to Japan from Myanmar in 2019 and graduated from SEISA Kokusai Shonan in March 2022, also participated online from Myanmar. In this program, Dejen from Eritrea and Penjor from Bhutan who are both studying at SEISA University summarized their visits to Enoshima and Kamakura and introduced themselves to Myanmar students.

There was also a scene where they enjoyed a Japanese drum performance by SEISA Japanese drum group "Dako-on". It was the first time for SEIAS's international students to experience Japanese drums, and they danced their hearts out to the strong yet comfortable and powerful sounds and reverberations.

In addition, on Sports Ch. (5ch), SAAB's first attempt at a charity marathon, "Let's connect the sash of smile" project. Six runners completed the 50km distance from Ninomiya-machi, Naka-gun to the Yokohama venue (SEISA High School) by handing the sash. The final runner was Kesete, a staff member of FGC who has been working as a bridge between Eritrea and Japan. He cut the finishing tape at the Yokohama venue among a lively and loud cheering crowd. After the race, he said, "I really appreciate former Chairperson Yasuo Miyazawa and that I am now able to fulfill my mission as a bridge between the two countries. I am sincerely grateful. I will continue to do what I can do in my own way to fulfill my role in the future."

SAAB will continue to move forward in order to realize the philosophy of "Kyosei" that we cherish in various ways.

2022 Eritrea track and field training camp report



I'm Dejen, a fourth-year student at SEISA University. In the summer of 2022, I joined a track and field training camp in Asmara, Eritrea. I would like to report about the camp.

First, my friend picked me up after arriving at Asmara airport, Eritrea. I was very happy. The next day, I met fellow track and field athletes, and of course, everyone was very happy. And I was able to practice at the stadium while communicating with the athletes of the World Championships Representatives.

Summer in Eritrea is not as humid as in Japan, and the temperature is stable, so we can practice comfortably. I was able to get up early every morning and gather with Eritrean athletes to practice together for the first time in a long time.

In Japan, I always practice by myself, so I was very happy that I was able to train at the best level at the training camp, which increased my motivation. I thought that training with athletes in a different category than myself was also part of KYOSEI. I once again realize that it was a very good experience.

Also, this summer's training camp in Eritrea has been a long-term training camp after a long time, as we were unable to do it for two and a half years due to the COVID-19 pandemic. It was also an opportunity to learn the importance of connecting with people through the training camp.

We were able to train in Asmara, at a high altitude, and in many different places as well as track practice. In Eritrea, there are many training grounds that are perfect for long-distance which we can run without any worries and also cross-country fields, which are not hard on the legs.

After practice, all track and field athletes gathered, and we were able to go to a restaurant and eat three times a week with the support of local companies in Asmara who took care of us like the professional athletes' team. During my stay at the training camp, there were various problems and hardships. However, I am very glad that I was able to solve the problem with the support of these local companies.

It has been six years since I came to Japan. Thanks to everyone's support, I and other international students are able to stay in Japan. And I am very happy to be able to do track and field, and study.

In particular, I would like to express my heartfelt gratitude to former Chairperson Yasuo Miyazawa for his sympathy, compassion, and kindness toward us.
